It is important to emphasize here that we do not work for salvation but do need to work it out when we get saved. The Holy Spirit enables us to do this. Many have been made to believe that receiving Christ as Lord and Savior is all that is required to make it to Heaven and have eternal life, regardless of the lifestyle one chooses to live; but this is not true. The truth is that all does not end with the Prayer of Salvation. Making a decision to receive Him is the starting point of our blissful relationship with God. Jesus Christ will never turn His back on those who believe in, and receive Him (John 6:37, Matthew 18:11-13). That said, a person who claims to have received Him may very well do the *turning* directly or
