(John 3:16)

God created us all in His own image (Genesis 1:27). He also gave us the freedom to make our own choices. We would have had to involuntarily love and obey Him if He had created us as robots, but His plan at the time of creation was not to compel us (His most beloved creatures) to make choices that would be against our own will. God wants to receive genuine love back from us. He would rather have us submit to Him because we choose to do so, and not as a matter of compulsion.

God gave us freewill, but also warned us of the consequences of sin, just as He warned Adam and Eve when He told them not to eat from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil (Genesis 2:16-17). Let us examine a few of the consequences of the Gift of Freewill He gave us:

Will God let a person do whatever he wishes to do, even if it is a sin?

Yes, He will. Remember that He has been gracious to give us freewill.

Can God stop a person from sinning?

Yes, He can, through the Holy Spirit and the person's cooperation. This is one of the reasons it is important to receive the Gift of Salvation He offered us through Jesus Christ. When you do, the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in you.

Thank You, Jesus for dying for my sins so that I can be forgiven and have Eternal Life. Amen.

If you said this prayer from the bottom of your heart, we rejoice with you because you are now a child of God (John 1:12-13).

3. Believe in your heart that Jesus Christ died for your sins on the Cross, and rose from the dead.

4. Then bow your head and say the simple prayer of salvation below.

Dear God, I confess that I am a sinner. Please forgive me. I am a truly sorry, and now want to forsake my sins. I believe that Your Son, Jesus died for my sins, was resurrected from the dead, and is alive. I confess Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour and invite Him to reign in my heart from this day forward.
